Formed in 2015 and initially developing out of a series of informal workshop sessions in South London, the Vitality Five are an all-star quintet dedicated to performing and recording authentic 1920s small-group jazz. Specialising in the kind of blistering 'hot stomps' inspired by the records of the California Ramblers,



Jelly Roll Morton's Red Hot Peppers and many others, the Five include sensational virtuosi from the UK, USA and Australia. Since their formation they have appeared at festivals and toured across Britain and Europe, performed live on BBC Radio Three and recorded an eponymous debut album (2016) which is now available. The band comprise **Michael McQuaid** (clarinet, alto saxophone & trumpet), **David Horniblow** (bass saxophone & clarinet), **Martin Wheatley**, (banjo & guitar), **Colin Good** (piano) and **Nicholas D. Ball** (drums & percussion).

Bar Seven Free Entry Humour and musical virtuosity are guaranteed with "Slide by Slide", an ensemble led by outstanding trombonists **Kevin Grenfell** and **Richard Leach**. They are supported by a dazzling rhythm section consisting of piano, double bass and drums. Formed in 2009 "Slide by Slide" very quickly established a firm reputation and loyal fan base. Such is the rapid growth of the musical prowess and popularity of "Slide by Slide" that it was nominated for the award of best newcomer band at Marlborough International Jazz... Festival and was elected Band of the Year by Stafford Jazz Society. A wide range of musical repertoire ensures an entertainment experience to savour from Jazz standards to popular classics through the decades. With Kevin and Richard are **Simon Smith** (bass), **Richard Hughes** (piano) and **Steve Street (**drums).

Alan Barnes is a prolific international performer, composer, arranger, bandleader and touring soloist. He is best known for his work on clarinet, alto and baritone sax, where he combines a formidable virtuosity with a musical expression and collaborative spirit that have few peers. Alan Barnes's unique musicianship, indefatigable touring, and warm rapport with audiences have made him uniquely popular in British jazz.

John Hallam is an outstanding and accomplished musician who is equally at ease with many forms of music on a number of reed instruments. His playing has the ability to be innovative and thrilling as well as



sensitively moving. As a freelance professional musician, he has worked with many of the finest musicians from both sides of the Atlantic, and his work has covered recordings for radio, television, jazz workshops and projects for education.

Sought after for his swinging piano style, **Tom Kincaid** has become the first choice of many touring artists and bandleaders, performing with jazz saxophonists Art Themen and Scott Hamilton, as well as his childhood hero, rock 'n' roll legend Shakin' Stevens. His influences range from Errol Garner and Oscar Peterson to Professor Longhair and Dr. John. He currently tours with Elkie Brooks.

Born in Birmingham **Nick Millward** was given his first drum kit at the age of 5 and was soon to be inspired by the likes of Gene Krupa, Ed Thigpen, Dennis Chambers and in particular the drummer he has styled himself on, Buddy Rich. Nick turned professional when he became a member of the Pete Allen Jazzband, before joining Kenny Ball. **Tom Clarke-Hill** (bass) originates from California but is now based in the UK. He studied double bass with Tiny Martin of the Boston Symphony, attended Berklee School of Music in Boston and launched into a professional career playing in Les Browns Band of Renown.

### John Shillito's Riviera Ramblers

The Riviera Ramblers is a Devon-based quintet playing music from the exciting jazz and swing era of the 1920s, 30s and 40s. Popular performers at jazz clubs and festivals, they also have several long-standing pub and restaurant residencies and make excellent, atmospheric music with a repertoire that is attractive and accessible. Audiences and dancers alike enjoy the



band's programmes of nostalgic, melodic, timeless, foot-tapping tunes, interspersed with engaging vocals from John and Zoe. The ensemble sound is relaxed, free and easy, warmly evoking memories of dance halls of New Orleans, speakeasies of Harlem and Parisiancafe gypsy-jazz. Solos are articulate, crafted with care, warmth and, often, humour. How ever you like your music, rhythmic or romantic, sentimental or swinging, bluesey or bright and breezy, you'll discover why the Riviera Ramblers are happy to have been described as 'more than just your average jazz band'. ### **Fret and Fiddle**

Fret and Fiddle have come a long way since forming in 2001 as a duo making their mark as a tribute to Stephane Grappelli and Django Reinhardt. Since those early days playing at small folk and blues clubs and experimenting with their repertoire they have enjoyed over a decade of success as a trio, winning awards such as Stafford Jazz Society's "Band of the Year" and



producing over four albums of material. Prepare to be dazzled by Fret and Fiddle's show which takes you through the swing music of the 1920s, the blues, Americana, folk, gypsy and some foot-tapping fiddle tunes. Come and hear songs from the shows such as Anything Goes by Cole Porter, sing along to old hits like I Can't Give you Anything but Love and prepare to be dazzled by Andy's Greek Bouzouki playing! This versatile and entertaining group even throw in a few refreshingly individual songs by the likes of Tom Waits and Leonard Cohen, making certain that there is something in every show to delight everyone in every audience. **Sally Minchin** plays violin and sings with **Andy Bole** on guitar, bouzouki and banjo, and **Simon Smith** on double bass.

Started by Joseph Trudgeon as a cross generational project, Trudgeon's Trad Jazz Troubadours philosophy is based around bringing young and old jazz musicians and their audience together whilst preserving the musical traditions of 1920s and 30s. Regularly seen around the country they can be found delighting the young and old at pubs, clubs, weddings, private parties with their authentic brand of traditional



jazz. Their line-up includes a who's who of jazz musicians from the south of the country. Some members have been playing traditional jazz around the circuit for 40+ years and are still very much at the top of their games, others are from a younger generation than the original trad jazz revivalists but have an equal amount of love and care for this old music as their elders. We are delighted to welcome back Ben Cummings (trumpet) to the Upton Jazz Festival. An extremely versatile player, Ben has played and recorded at the highest level in many genres from New Orleans, swing and modern jazz, to funk, soul, pop and salsa. Ben plays with Caro Emerald, Puppini Sisters, Jacqui Dankworth, Jamie Cullum and Imelda May, amongst others.

Since turning professional, David Deakin has become a regular face at many of the UK's jazz clubs and venues. He has shared stages with many of the top and upcoming jazz musicians. David plays both string bass and souse as well as trombone. He is a trained musician, fluent sight reader and comfortable in many styles from jazz and classical to pop and chamber music.

Nick Ward began playing drums at the age of thirteen with a local brass band, and stayed with them for many years. He currently plays professionally with numerous jazz bands, and over the years has appeared on twenty six recordings. He has performed at jazz festivals in eleven countries, including Finland, Hungary and the USA, and has accompanied such iazz areats as Benny Waters and Doc Cheatham. He collects, restores and plays antique drum kits dating from the 1920s and 1930s.

TJ Johnson is widely considered to be one of the UK's most charismatic highly revered Jazz and Blues singers. He is also a hot piano player and respected bandleader. He was presented with



Best Blues Singer by Jools Holland at the 2018 Boisdale music awards. TJ sings songs of the night, songs of hope and despair, taking you on a musical trail from the Jazz dives of New Orleans, the foot tapping Honky Tonks of Texas to the Hip Speakeasies of New York. Drawing from a rich eclectic mix of influences such as Dr John, Ray Charles, Jimmy Witherspoon, Billie Holiday, Frank Sinatra and Willie Nelson, TJ shapes the music into his own individual style with a professional yet relaxed stage manner. He sprang on to the Jazz scene in the late 80s as a jazz singer with Max Collie at the age of 17 and since forming his own band in 1990 has performed extensively for over thirty years now at many Theatres, Festivals and Jazz clubs both in the UK and overseas. With **TJ Johnson** (piano, vocals) are **Alex Clarke** (alto sax, flute), **Wesley Gibbens** (drums) and **Tim Fairhall** (double bass).

A few years ago the all-female band, the Creole Belles stole a few hearts at the Purcell Rooms in London, going on to perform to popular acclaim around the country at various clubs and Festivals. The present 5 piece line-up came from that popular band, playing an impressive variety of styles, from 1930s swing to 1940s cool, with an occasional glance back to the 1920s, making over



old standards with fresh arrangements, playing with panache and an obvious infectious enjoyment. The addition of Boswell Sisters type three-part harmonies are a superb feature of this band.
